On Wed. Sept 28, Grade 9 students and their TAG teachers were welcomed to the WKC Community in a special TAWOW Ceremony with Elder Betty McKenna. Elder Betty told students, teachers, and parents about her philosophy of the Seven Stones – where each stone represents a quality that all young people need: Growth, Order, Adequacy, Love, Social Approval, Security and Self Esteem.

This one stone is meant to symbolize the Seven Stones Philosophy and by keeping it serves to remind us of the qualities we need to create a balanced and healthy life.
