Credit Information

**Secondary Level Credit Requirements**

Saskatchewan Education requires a minimum of 24 credits for graduation, at least 5 of which shall be 30 level credits. Credit counts begin at the grade 10 level. Compulsory courses are:

Grade 10 · English A10, English B10, Social Studies 10 or Native Studies 10, Math 10 or 11, Science 10.

Grade 11 · English A20, Math 20 or 21, a Science 20 or 30, a Social Science 20 or 30.

Grade 12 · English A30, English B30, Social Studies 30 or Native Studies 30.

Saskatchewan Education policy requires students to pass at least two (2) courses from the Arts Education / Practical & Applied Arts areas at the 10, 20, or 30 level. A Wellness or Physical Education credit at the 10, 20, or 30 level is required. Modified credits are not accepted for university entrance and may limit SIAST entrance. Students may choose to take a modified course and then move back into a regular credit class (example is Math 11 to Math 10).

**TAG (Teacher Advisory Group)** is a compulsory course for all students at Winston Knoll Collegiate.

After successfully completing Grade 9 and Grade 10 Level TAG, students earn a Life Transitions 20 credit.

After successfully completing Grade 11 and Grade 12 Level TAG, students earn a Life Transitions 30 credit.

**Minimum Course Requirements in addition to TAG:**

Grade 10 - 10 credits (no spares and are not permitted to drop classes)

Grade 11 - 9 credits (1 spare maximum)

Grade 12 - 8 credits (2 spares maximum)

**Elective Course Fees:**

Elective classes may have a fee. For information on specific class fees you may contact the office.

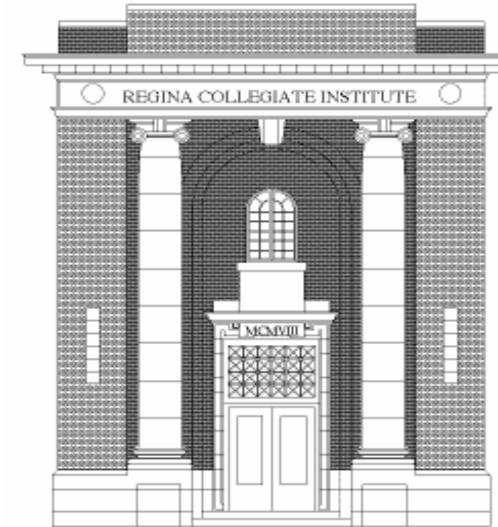
